"A professional achievement would definitely be the time that a hotel didn't find 5 of the 10 rooms we had booked for a group. And the hotel was fully booked.

I'm really excited to work in a global leader in financial services. I will bring the


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EXAMPLE #4: IF YOU ARE APPLYING FOR A JOB WITH NO EXPERIENCE

What's more, I like the social aspect of going to work. It helps with motivation, and interactions you have in real time cannot be replaced by some chat or emails, or emojis or similar stuff. At least that's my opinion."





"WHAT ARE YOUR HOBBIES AND INTERESTS?"

EXAMPLE #3

"I love traveling, and I try to take a trip every season. On my last trip to Boston, my flight was delayed, and I had a show to get to. I scheduled my rideshare from the hotel to the theater to save time. Once I got to my hotel, I had about 10 minutes to settle into my room and then get into my rideshare to the theater.

Traveling allows me to adapt to new situations and use my organization and planning skills to ensure I have the most fun I can. These strategies prepare me for many possible situations, which is how I approach my event and travel planning as an administrative assistant."









"HOW DO YOU HANDLE STRESS?"

EXAMPLE #1

"When I am in a stressful situation, I often stop to take a step back and allow myself some time to think, plan and prioritize. For example, if I have more than one task to do at my current job, I break the big tasks up into separate, individual activities, working out which take the longest, which I can complete quite quickly, and which have the nearest deadlines. It then becomes more manageable and far less stressful."

EXAMPLE #2

"Due to my previous responsibilities, I have learnt how to deal with stress effectively. The main thing is to focus on the most important tasks and don't let stress get in the way."
